









Chart Overview 2019-2023

Looking Ahead 2024

A Collaboration with VisitHouston

VisitHouston, Houston First's Tourism department, selected us and other non-profit organizations and Black-owned businesses to create elevated tour experiences in and around Downtown Houston. They worked with local organizations and attractions to design and develop experiences and itineraries tied to Houston's African American history and heritage for leisure travelers, locals, and group visitors. To successfully develop multicultural experiences, they connected with the sites and/or community organizations that are keepers of the stories. Their idea is to bring the attractions/venues to life and make them more immersive.

We held a media event on Friday, February 9, with President and CEO of Houston First Corporation Michael Heckman and President of Greater Houston Convention and Visitors Bureau Jorge Franz. Their speeches were about the value of diversity and embracing Black Houston activities year-round. Their speech and presentation of the 5 Downtown/Midtown business experiences who were part of this tourism project is available on our YouTube page. There were also several media mentions on TV and print.

Consultation by Joe Veneto, Chief Experience Officer of Veneto Collaboratory

For one year, VisitHouston provided us with professional consultation by Joe Veneto, a multicultural product development expert whose sole profession is to cultivate multicultural experiences across the US.

From Plantation to Emancipation – The Freedom Experience (begins Feb. 10)

During a tour of three historic houses that tell Houston's stories from plantation to emancipation, a talented actor brings the hardships of slavery and the victory of freedom to life in dramatic reenactments. The historical script was written by **Martha Whiting-Goddard**, Reverend Jack Yates' great granddaughter, who lived in the Yates House that was relocated to Sam Houston Park.

Explore the following three houses that are designated by **UNESCO** as **Sites of Memory** for their "Routes of Enslaved Peoples' Project" - **1847 Kellum-Noble House**; **1866 Fourth Ward Cottage**; and **1870 Yates House**. "Sites of Memory," or "Sites of Conscience" are historic places that activate the power of memory to engage the public in a deeper understanding of the past, inspiring action to shape a more just future. These sites break the silence surrounding slavery, and place the tragedy into our universal memory. It is only through dialogue that we can have peace and reconciliation. We

have a duty to remember the crimes committed against humanity by our ancestors, especially as we see the return of prejudice and discrimination today.

The talented reenactor, **Khi Stephens**, brings the hardships of slavery and the victory of freedom to life through song, a Library of Congress slave narrative, and a portrayal written by a descendant of the Reverend Jack Yates. Stephens studied theater in Los Angeles and was coached by Martha Whiting-Goddard on her roles.

From Plantation to Emancipation – The Freedom Experience begins on Saturday, February 10 in celebration of Black History Month. These 90-minute tours are offered on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month; from 12:30 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.

2023 SUMMARY

We hosted 76 events and programs, and 42% of our programs and events had elements of diversity and another 16% specifically addressed women's interests. 30% focused on Houston History and Texas History. 63% of our programs and events were free.

2023 MUSEUM GALLERY EXHIBITS

100% of our exhibits displayed elements of diversity.

- The Life and Times of Charles Goodnight Exhibit shared Native American relationships with cattleguards men and settlers through several paintings.
- The *Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo History Exhibit* changed out their exhibits to include Black Heritage, Hispanic Heritage, and Children with Disabilities.
- Joe Aker *Faces of the Other* surrounded Sam Houston Park's fences and our building's fence line with diverse faces of people.
- The **New Red Book Exhibit** showcased 50 Black historical and cultural sites. Dr. Lindsay Gary offered several programs to the public, and her exhibit complemented Juneteenth. She received a declaration from the Mayor.
- A Civil Rights Milestone: President JFK's Visit with LULAC in Houston brought several programs and complemented National Hispanic Heritage Month. LULAC received a declaration from the Mayor. This was also our first bilingual exhibit. More than 1,000 people saw the exhibit and at least 985 seriously engaged with the content. Of the 985 visitors, 416 were school children who completed activities related to the exhibit (i.e., scavenger hunts and tours of the exhibit itself).
- **UH Latino/a cArtographies** displayed their digital art board for National Hispanic Heritage Month and the Kennedy LULAC exhibit. They also made an avatar of our Executive Director, so she could virtually showcase our Mexican American mural.
- Our staff presented a **Pride Houston** pop-up for the second year.
- The Houston Suffragists Project presented a pop-up for a **Juneteenth Program** in the gallery.
- The Houston Suffragists Project presented a pop-up for Women's Equality Day in the gallery.
- **AO Art Show** acquired several international artists and vendors for our Holiday Bus Tours and Annual Candlelight Tours on the weekends for seven weeks.
- By opening later in the evening, for Holiday Bus Tours and Winter Wanderland on Bagby Street for seven weeks, we were able to serve young, diverse families.
